
## 2003 TRS Scholarship Awards



How did you do?

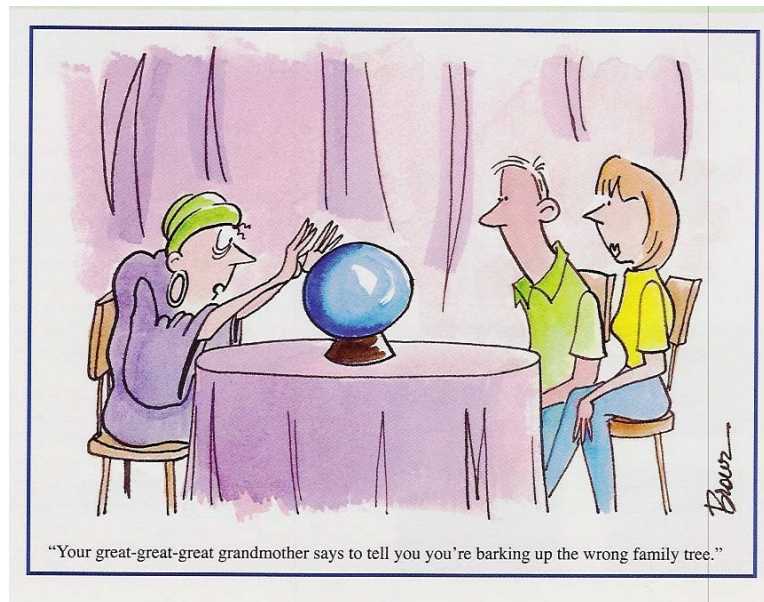

## HENRY HUTTLESTON ROGERS

He made Fairhaven, MA A Architectural Gem

**O**n a granite monument on the southwest lawn of the Fairhaven High School are the impressive Latin words, “*Si monumentum requies circumspice,*” which translated into English means “*If you would see his work, look about you.*” Strolling through the el-shaded streets of this Massachusetts town located in the southeaster section of the state, across the Acushnet River from New Bedford that was the Whaling City of the world during the 19<sup>th</sup> century, you learn of the imprint one man made in the sands of time.

**H**enry Huttleston Rogers could once have been singled out as the man least likely to succeed at anything. Born in Fairhaven January 29, 1840, the son of Rowland and Mary (Eldridge) Rogers, he was, like you and me, a direct descendent of **Thomas Rogers** who left Leiden, Holland on the ship Speedwell that was to take passengers to New England. When a leak was discovered it became necessary for them to go aboard the ship **Mayflower** whose destination was Plymouth. As members of the **Thomas Rogers Society** we share in the result of that historic trip. We’re cousins to a man who would be called one of the Robber Barons of America’s Gilded Age, 1850-1890. Sometimes called the era of extravagance and change. Cousin Henry was a part of that change.

**H**enry’s roots come from **Joseph Rogers**, son of **Thomas**, who left Plymouth and located in Eastham on lower Cape Cod. (Ed. Note: I’m from Joseph but none of Henry’s business acumen rubbed off onto me.) Fairhaven had been settled in 1652 by a band of colonists from Plymouth under the leadership of Thomas Cooke. It seems that the town was destined to be touched by a Mayflower descendent. The War of 1812 put Fairhaven on the map because New Bedford was called Tory Town and the “Corsicans” of Fairhaven applied for and were granted papers of incorporation to establish Fairhaven as a town.

**H**enry Rogers was not the most promising or enthusiastic young man in school but he managed to graduate from high school in 1856. Later in life he was the instigator for class reunions and he paid all the expenses. He worked as a grocery clerk for three dollars per week. When he considered the stipend too low for his services he became a baggage-man for the Fairhaven Branch Railroad for \$1.16 a day. He was a born rebel and tired to arouse the townspeople to build a better high school. Their reply was “We don’t need any suggestions from that kid.” They would live to regret those words.

**W**hen petroleum was oozing form the ground in Pennsylvania his friend, William M. Irish was the first to “go west” to seek his fortune. Then Charles H. Ellis, another friend, followed Irish. In 1861 Henry Rogers took the \$600 he had saved and headed for the oil fields that eventually, through his wizardry and hard dealings, join him with men who would later develop Standard Oil Co. When Yale University chemistry professor George H. Bissell proved that oil could be refined and used for lighting fuel, towns like Rouseville and Titusvill, PA took on the atmosphere of the California Gold Rush of 1849. Saloons, brothels, sleazy hotels and rooming houses reminded Henry Rogers of New Bedford in the whaling days. Oil would put the whaling industry out of business.

**H**e returned to Fairhaven to marry his childhood sweetheart, Abbie Palmer Gifford, who proved to be sensible, down-to-earth wife and mother and as a modest hostess for their social life of New York City. The marriage resulted in the births of four girls and Henry Huttleston Jr., who was called Harry. When the family hove in Fairhaven burned in 1894 Henry replaced it with an 85-room mansion that would house his family in the summer months. It had eighteen bedrooms and playrooms for the children, bowling lanes, wine cellars and a kitchen large enough for a hotel. When Henry died in 1909 his son, Harry, told the townspeople he was planning to convert it into a summer hotel. The town objected and Harry had the home demolished in 1915. One buyer paid \$1,000 for a Waterford crystal chandelier and James Michael Curley, several times mayor of Boston and once governor of Massachusetts, purchased the marble fireplace and fixtures which were thought to be brass but proven to be gold-plated, for his new Jamaica Plain (Boston) home that he would eventually lose but taken by the city as a museum.

**H**enry gave the town a library and named it for his daughter, Millicent, who died at age 17. He had been raised as a Master Mason in Star In the East Lodge, New Bedford. When Concordia Lodge of Fairhaven outgrew its meeting place Henry Rogers proposed building the Lodge a new commodious building if they would change the name to George H. Taber Lodge in memory of his childhood Sunday School teacher, friend and “like a father to me.” He spent \$50,000 to erect the three-floor granite structure with first floor rental to help support the future. He finished the lodge rooms with new furniture, a pump organ that is now electronic, and gave the chairs of the Master and Wardens to Noquochoke Lodge of Westport, MA..

**W**hen the telephone was perfected as a means of communication, Rogers had one of the first in Fairhaven installed in his mother’s home. He called her daily from his New York office. He lived with his family at 26 East 57<sup>th</sup> Street in New York City and then at East 78<sup>th</sup> Street.

**A** strong bond had developed between Rogers and Samuel L. Clemens, better known as Mark Twain of Huckleberry Finn and Tom Sawyer fame. When Twain foolishly invested about \$200,000 in a typesetting machine at Hartford, CT, Rogers convinced him it was a bad investment. He often bailed Twain out of financial distress and when Rogers made the gift of a new Fairhaven town hall from his wife, Mark Twain was the principal speaker for the occasion. He paid for the education of Helene Keller into Radcliffe College (Harvard) and financially supported Booker T. Washington in building schools for blacks in the south.

**H**e built the White Home for Nurses, a memorial to his friend Dr. Charles Warren White, Jr., and donated it to St. Luke’s Hospital in New Bedford. He had Cushman Pond filled in to serve as the town’s recreation area and contributed to the Messiah Home for Little Children in New York City. The new high school he endowed and built was dedicated in 1906, and at his death his estate endowed most of the other buildings.

**S**itting in pew No. 14 on the north side of the sanctuary of The Memorial Church of Fairhaven (Unitarian Universalist) I paused to contemplate the glorious works of the 15<sup>th</sup> century English Gothic structure that Henry Rogers built as a memorial to his mother following her death in 1899.

**T**his edifice is a “must see” if you are in the area of Fairhaven, MA. Begun in 1901 and completed three years later, it replaced an old wooden church. The exterior is native granite from a ledge on the Rogers former estate near Fort Phoenix, Fairhaven; the tower is of granite and carved limestone. Exterior and interior limestone sculpture – including more exquisitely-wrought Christian and secular (largely medieval) heads than anyone has ever counted – is the work of a team of artisans brought from Italy for the three years work. Interior wood carvings accomplished by a group of Bavarian and German artisans under direction of the Bavarian master John Kirkmayer, are of rare English bog oak.

**T**he stained glass windows of Tiffany by American Impressionist Robert Reid whose fame as a New York Portrait painter was at it height in early 1900’s are dominated by the Memorial Window, the Nativity at the pulpit, a 71 foot nave, and the sermon on the Mount at opposite end. Each window is 24 feet high. The Rev. Robert Collyer, D.D., Rogers New York minister and close friend, a clean-shaven Samuel Clemens (Mark Twain) are depicted in the windows. Reid’s work required two years to complete. Above the center aisle are ten winged wood sculptures covered with beaten gold; each is ten feet high and represents one of the ten intellectual attributes; philosophy, rhetoric, arithmetic, music, geometry, grammar, astrology, metaphysics, dialectic and theology.

**O**f the five entrances to the church perhaps the most renowned is the south porch, whose bronze doors consist of two leaves, each weighing two-and-a-quarter tons. On their exterior are 38 nine-inch figures of persons chosen from 19 centuries of Roman Catholic and Protestant thought. King Alfred the Great is the only “civic” leader among them. On the floor is an owl made up of 12 signs of the Zodiac, in brass, and in the upper right corner, looking towards the outdoors is a little “church mouse” in the limestone-actually a squirrel. Of the hundreds of limestone and wooden faces – no two are alike. One depicts a cross-eyed worker. The cathedral type church is supported by ten flying buttresses. This is a place to see and study. In the spring of the year one Sunday is in memory of Henry Huttleston Rogers and some of his grandchildren and I imagine great-grandchildren by this time, try to be present. I met some in 1989 when I wrote his story when I was the editor for Trowel Magazine, published by the Grad Lodge of Masons in Massachusetts.

**H**e also built Tabitha Inn, named for his maternal grandmother, Tabitha Crowell, as a place for visitors to stay. It is now owned by the Fall River Roman Catholic Diocese and used as a home for the aged. To give

employment for his fellow townsmen he purchased the Atlas Tack Co. of Fairhaven and Taunton, closing the latter business but erecting a new building in Fairhaven. He built a grammar school in nearby Mattapoisett in memory of his paternal grandparents, Abisha and Judith (Cushman) Rogers. He also purchased the old Bank of Commerce in New Bedford for the Old Dartmouth Historical Society.

**H**is heirs still contribute to the Millicent Library and the church. For many years some were trustees of the library. No figures of his worth were ever released at the time of his death, but it has been estimated his estate was worth about sixty-five million. Not bad for a young fellow who left his town with six hundred dollars in his pocket.

**T**he warm and human side of Henry Huttleston Rogers has been painted for you. He dealt with the moguls of his time; John D. and William Rockefeller, E.P. Harriman, John D. Archibald, the Everests, Lockhart, Warden, McGregor and others. He was labeled the “Jekyll and Hyde of Wall Street.” Yet, it was Rogers who was the only one to recognize Edwin L. Drake, a conductor on the New York, New Haven and Hartford Railroad, with no business or technical experience, who believed and proved that oil could be brought to the surface by drilling. Rogers erected a monument to him in Titusville.

**I**n 1907 Federal Judge Kenesaw Mountain Landis fined Standard Oil \$29 million for the monopoly that had been created. President Teddy Roosevelt who had appointed Landis as a judge exclaimed “Bully for him!” when he heard of the fine. But the Supreme Court ruled otherwise and the fine was wiped out. In 1911 Standard Oil had to divest itself of its subsidiaries and reorganize into 38 companies. When a cattleman sold diseased beef Landis locked him in jail but President Woodrow Wilson commuted the sentence to a few months. When men were accused of stealing sugar from a Chicago freight car Landis stated in court, “stealing sugar is no more deserving of a prison sentence than selling diseased beef,” and let them off. Landis would ultimately be appointed the commissioner of major league baseball as a result of the Black Sox Scandal of 1919. He ruled baseball with an iron fist. No commissioner since has had as much authority.

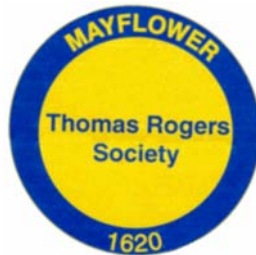
