Albert Keenlyne, widely known Maxwell resident, and Chairman of the Buffalo County Board, died at his home Thursday December 27. He had been in poor health for 16 months and been confined to his bed for the last 9 weeks.

Mr. Keenlyne was active for years in community affairs. He was Clerk of the Maxwell School District for 20 years and served as Town Chairman for 15 years and was Director of the Buffalo Electric Cooperative. He was President of the Utility at the time. He played a prominent role last

year when the Maxville School District was consolidated with Durand.

Born August 22, 1894, at Maxville, Mr. Keenlyne was the son of Charles L. and Ida Doane Keenlyne. He attended school on Maxville Prairie and lived in that area through out his life.

In May 1919, Mr. Keenlyne and the former Tillie Johnson were married. They became the parents of ten children, two of whom preceeded their father in death, Harlan who died in March 1931 at the age of 11 days and Carmen who also died as an infant.

Surviving with their mother are Mrs. Carl (Leota) Felde of Shebogan, Mrs. Gerry (Doris) Andrus, Mrs. Grant (Charlotte) Sites, Mrs. Leslie (Jean) Stewart, and Leroy of Durand, Muriel and Marlene of Minneapolis and Kent a sophomore at Durand High School who resides at home.

Other survivors are five sisters, Mrs. Laura Rodenbiser, Mrs. Iona Karshbam, Mrs. Effie Rosenberg, and Minnie Keenlyne of Durand and Mrs. Richard V. (Hazel) Boyer of ~~East~~ Ogish. There are 17 grandchildren, and one sister, Mrs. Beryl Boyd is dead.

Fraternally, Mr. Keenlyne was a member of the Odd Fellows Lodge at Durand and the Modern Woodmen of Mishawaka.

The esteem of Mr. Keenlyne was evident at funeral services which were held Monday December 31, at the Goodrich Chapel in Durand. There was an overflow crowd. The Rev. S.J. Schmelling of the Durand Methodist Church had charge of the last rites and burial was in Forest Hills Cemetary.
